GRAND COURT (PROCEEDINGS BY AND
AGAINST THE CROWN) RULES

CROWN PROCEEDINGS LAW
(Law 27 of 1965)

1. Every claim against the Crown shall aver the circumstances in which the Crown's liability is alleged to have arisen and the Department and officers of the Crown concerned.
2. Service upon the Crown shall be effected by service upon the Attorney General or a person nominated by him for that purpose.
3. No counter-claim or set-off shall be pleaded against the Crown without the leave of the Court in that behalf.
4. No judgment in default of appearance or default of pleading shall be entered against the Crown save by leave of the Court and after notice served upon the Crown.
5. No third party notice for service on the Crown shall be issued without the leave of the Court.
6. In civil proceedings to which the Crown is a party no order shall be made requiring the disclosure of the existence of any document if such disclosure would, in the opinion of the Chief Secretary, be injurious to the public interest.
7. There is no right of execution of any judgment or order made against the Crown but where the Court makes such a judgment or order it shall issue to the person in whose favour such judgment or order is made a certificate addressed to the Chief Secretary in the following form.
