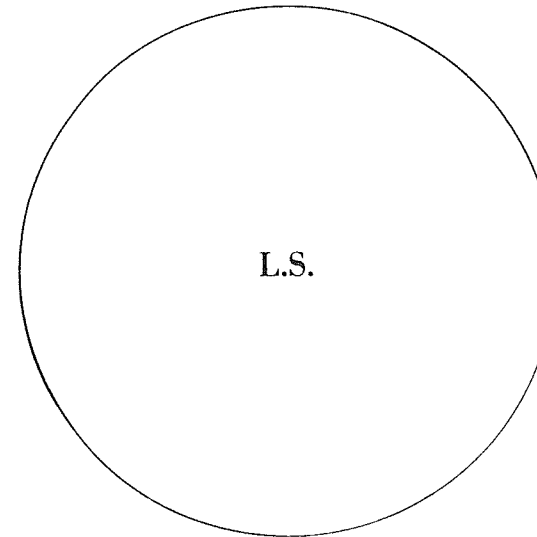

A LAW TO AMEND THE TOWNS AND COMMUNITIES LAW

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This amendment will introduce measures to prevent litter until a comprehensive law is passed.

A LAW to amend the Towns and Communities Law.

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Towns and Communities (Amendment) Law 1977.

Section 3 of Cap 169 amended.

2. Section 3 of the Towns and Communities Law is amended as follows:—

a) By inserting the figure and brackets "(1)" between the figure "3" and the word "Every" where they appear in the first line thereof:

b) By the addition of the following new subsection thereto:

(2) If any person throws down, drops or otherwise deposits in, into or from any road or place to which the public are entitled or permitted to have access, or leaves anything whatsoever including but without limiting the generality of the foregoing any paper, bottle, tin can, packing material, offal, carrion, refuse, wrecked car or other vehicle or litter in such circumstances as to cause, contribute to, or tend to lead to, the defacement by litter of any such place or road, then, unless that depositing and leaving was authorised by law or was done with the consent of the owner, occupier or other person or
