**THE PORT [AMENDMENT] [NO. 2] REGULATIONS, 1980**

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Governor in Council by section 13 of the above Law the following Regulations are hereby made.

| Citation.   | 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Port (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations, 1980.  |
| Amendment of regulation 106 of the Port Regulations.      | <p>2. Sub-regulation (4) of regulation 106 of the Port Regulations (hereinafter referred to as the principal Regulations) is hereby amended by the revocation of paragraph (a) thereof and the substitution therefor of the following new paragraph —</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">“ (a) Imports <span style="float: right;">\$2.50</span></p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;"><b>Exception</b><br/>Clay, sand, limestone, sandstone or other stone commonly used for road making or building <span style="float: right;">\$3.00.”.</span></p> |
| Amendment of regulation 107 of the principal Regulations. | <p>3. Sub-regulation (1) of regulation 107 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the addition of the following proviso to paragraph (d) thereof —</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">“Provided that no charge shall be payable under this paragraph for clay, sand, limestone, sandstone or other stone commonly used for the purpose of road making or building carried in containers or trailers.”</p>   |
| Amendment of regulation 109 of the principal Regulations. | <p>4. Sub-regulation (1) of regulation 109 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the addition to paragraph (f) thereof of the following further proviso —</p> <p style="margin-left: 40px;">“And provided further that no charge shall be payable under this paragraph for handling or lifting any container which contains only clay, sand, limestone, sandstone or other stone commonly used for road making or building.”</p>  |
