A LAW TO AMEND THE MONETARY AUTHORITY LAW (2001 REVISION) TO PROVIDE FOR THE CHARGING OF FEES BY THE MONETARY AUTHORITY FOR MISCELLANEOUS ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES; AND FOR INCIDENTAL AND CONNECTED PURPOSES

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1. This Law may be cited as the Monetary Authority (Amendment) (Fees) Short title Law, 2001.

2. The Monetary Authority Law (2001 Revision) is amended by repealing section 40 and substituting the following-

Amendment of section 40 of the Monetary Authority Law (2001 Revision) - regulations

- "40. (1) The Governor may make regulations providing for such matters as may be contemplated by, or necessary for giving full effect to, this Law and for its administration including the charging of fees for any administrative service provided by the Authority to a licensee or to members of the public upon request.
 - (2) The Governor may, by regulations, amend Schedule 2.
- (3) Regulations made under subsection (2) are subject to the affirmative resolution of the Legislative Assembly.".
