THE CUSTOMS LAW (REVISED) ORDER

(NO. 3), 1978

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Governor by Section 10 (1) (d) of the above Law the import of any omnibus (as defined by section 2 of the Traffic Law) (No. 16 of 1973) is absolutely prohibited unless such omnibus conforms with the following conditions —

- (a) all passenger doors for normal use must be located on the near-side of such omnibus;
- (b) no door for normal use, other than one door for the exclusive use of the driver, may be located on the off-side of such omnibus;
- (c) an adequate number of emergency exits must be provided;
- (d) all doors and emergency exits must be clearly marked on the inside and outside and must be capable of being readily opened from the outside of such omnibus;
- (e) passenger doors must be so contrived as to be incapable of opening accidentally while the omnibus is in motion; and
- (f) passenger doors for normal use must be equipped with handrails, steps and lighting of a strength and design sufficient to ensure the safety of passengers making use thereof.

In this order "door" includes a door giving access to a luggage compartment.
