

to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three years or to both such fine or imprisonment.

(3) Where any offence under this section is committed by any company or other body corporate or by any society, association or body of persons, every person charged with or concerned or acting in control or management of the affairs of such company, body corporate, society, association or body of persons, shall also be guilty of such offence unless he proves that such offence was committed without his knowledge or consent and that he took all reasonable steps to prevent the commission of the offence."

**A LAW  
TO AMEND THE ENDANGERED SPECIES  
PROTECTION AND PROPAGATION LAW, 1978  
(LAW 21 OF 1978)**

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Endangered Species Protection and Propagation (Amendment) Law, 1983.

Amendment of long title of the principal Law.

2. The long title of the Endangered Species Protection and Propagation Law, 1978, hereinafter called the principal Law, is amended by the deletion of the words “importation and exportation” and the substitution therefor of the words “killing importation and exportation”.

Addition of new section to the principal Law.

3. The newly entitled principal Law is amended by the addition, immediately following section 6, of the following new section —

“Prohibition on killing. 6A (1) The Governor may, by Order published in the Gazette, prohibit the killing within the Islands, the territorial waters or the fisheries zone thereof, and for such period as may be therein specified, of such animals, being animals listed in the Schedule to the principal Law, as are specified in such Order:

(2) Any person who contravenes the provisions of subsection (1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$10,000 or
