4. Section 5 of the principal Law is amended by substituting -

- (a) "orders" for "Orders in Council" in the second line of subsection (2);
- (b) "orders" for "Orders" in the third line of subsection (2).

Amendment of s. 10.

5. Section 10 of the principal Law is amended by -

- (a) deleting "in Council" in the fifth line of subsection (1);
- (b) substituting "order" for "Order in Council" in the first line of subsection (2);
- (c) substituting "order" for "Order in Council" in the first line of subsection (3);
- (d) substituting "order" for "Order" in the latter line of subsection (3).

(LAW 9 OF 1986)**

A LAW TO AMEND THE FOREIGN JUDGMENTS
RECIPROCAL ENFORCEMENT LAW (REVISED)

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Foreign Judgments Reciprocal Enforcement (Amendment) Law, 1986.

Amendment of s. 2.

2. Section 2 of the Foreign Judgments Reciprocal Enforcement Law (Revised), in this Law referred to as the principal Law, is amended by inserting the following new definition immediately after the definition of “foreign” -

“ “Governor” means the Governor in Council;”

Amendment of s. 3.

3. Section 3 of the principal Law is amended by substituting -

- (a) “order” for “Order in Council” in the fifth line of subsection (1);
- (b) “order” for “Order” in the first line of paragraph (b) of subsection (1);
- (c) “order” for “Order in Council” in the first line of paragraph (c) of subsection (2);
- (d) “order” for “Order in Council” in the first line of subsection (4);
- (e) “order” for “Order” in the second line of subsection (4).
