(b) in the case of the George Town Water Supply Scheme , a deposit as follows -

which deposit is refundable together with interest as calculated in sub-regulation (2) to him on his application if he ceases to require the service.

(2) Interest on the deposit at the rate of five per cent per annum from the date of payment shall be added to the deposit:

Provided that the customer may at any time at the end of any calendar year require payment to him of such interest.

(3) If the monthly charge for any customer is in arrears for one month after its issue, the Authority shall apply the deposit and any accrued interest thereon towards payment of the arrears. There-upon a further deposit shall forthwith become due and payable to the Authority of the same amount mentioned in sub-regulation (1) plus, in the case of a connection to the West Bay Beach Sewerage Scheme, an on cost of fifteen per cent.

(4) Any person who fails to pay the further deposit mentioned in sub-regulation (3) within seven days of its becoming due and payable is guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty dollars in respect of each day during which the further deposit is unpaid.

10. The charge to be paid to the Authority for the supply of water to truckers from the reservoirs at Lower Valley and East End is two dollars per cubic metre.

11. Paragraph 10 of Schedule 2 of the Water Authority Regulations, 1985 is revoked.

THE WATER AUTHORITY LAW, 1982
(LAW 10 OF 1982)

THE WATER AUTHORITY REGULATIONS, 1988

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor in Council by section 60 of the Water Authority Law, 1982 and after consultation with the Water Authority, the following Regulations are hereby made -

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Water Authority Regulations, 1988.

WEST BAY BEACH SEWERAGE SCHEME

2. (1) The charges to be paid to the Authority for the collection, treatment and disposal of sewage via the West Bay Beach Sewerage Scheme (being a public sewerage system) are one dollar and thirty cents per Sewage Fixture Unit per month on each premises connected to that Scheme.

(2) In this regulation, Sewage Fixture Units are calculated as follows -

each private bedroom	6
each private bathroom	14
each bedroom in a hotel	18
each bathroom in an office, store or the like	40
each seat in a public dining room	2
each seat in a bar	0.5.

3. The charges to be paid to the Authority for the receipt of sewage at the sewage treatment works from a licensed cesspool emptier are thirty dollars for each load of septage.

Sale of effluent.

4. The charges to be paid to the Authority for the delivery of treated effluent for irrigation purposes is -

- (a) one dollar and sixty cents per cubic metre for the first four hundred cubic metres delivered in any month;
- (b) one dollar per cubic metre, for any amount in excess of four hundred cubic metres delivered in that month.

Connection fees.

5. (1) The charges and fees to be paid to the Authority for connecting premises to the West Bay Beach Sewerage Scheme at any time after the 1st day of June, 1988 are the actual cost of such connection plus fifty per cent.

(2) In respect of any connection under sub-regulation (1), the following provisions apply -

- (a) the Authority's responsibility for maintenance is limited to the upstream side of the disconnect chamber or manhole placed on or near the boundary of the premises in question;
- (b) the Authority is not responsible for any damages to the premises in question if it can show by its daily operational records that it did everything in its power to prevent the occurrence of such damage

GEORGE TOWN WATER SUPPLY SCHEME

Water charges.

6. (1) The charges to be paid to the Authority for the supply of desalinated water via the George Town Water Supply Scheme (being a public water supply system) are a monthly charge in accordance with the following categories of consumer or user -

- (a) Domestic \$3.45 per cubic metre for the first twelve cubic metres and \$3.85 for each cubic metre thereafter, subject to a minimum charge of \$13.07;
- (b) Truckers \$3.20 per cubic metre;

- (c) Water company \$3.20 per cubic metre;
- (d) Commercial \$3.85 per cubic metre, subject to a minimum charge of \$14.58;
- (e) Industrial \$3.85 per cubic metre, subject to a minimum charge of \$14.58;
- (f) Municipal \$3.45 per cubic metre, subject to a minimum charge of \$13.07.

(2) The charges prescribed in sub-regulation (1) do not include meter rental fees prescribed in paragraph 11 of Schedule 2 of the Water Authority Regulations, 1985.

Connection fees.

7. (1) The charges to be paid to the Authority for connecting to the George Town Water Supply Scheme, including the installation of the meter, are -

(2) If the supply of water is disconnected by the Authority under any power enabling it to do so, a re-connection charge shall be paid equal to the charge mentioned in sub-regulation (1) plus fifteen per cent before the supply of water is re-connected.

Fire hydrants.

8. The charge to be paid to the Authority in respect of each fire hydrant connected to the George Town Water Supply Scheme is twenty dollars per month.

GENERAL

Deposit.

9. (1) There shall be paid to the Authority by every person who connects to the West Bay Beach Sewerage Scheme or the George Town Water Supply Scheme -

- (a) in the case of the West Bay Beach Sewerage Scheme, a deposit equal to one month's sewerage charge as calculated in regulation 2;
