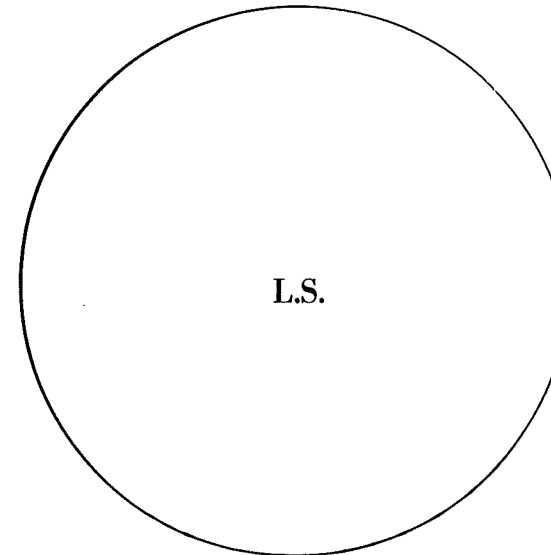

A LAW to Make Provision for Certain Division Fences.

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

Short title
and application.

1. This Law may be cited as the Division Fences Law, 1980, and shall apply to such areas as the Governor in Council may prescribe by order in the Gazette.

Expense of
division fence
to be borne
equally.

2. The labour and expense of constructing, repairing and maintaining any fence dividing adjoining lands both of which are used for agricultural purposes and of clearing any interval, gap or opening in such a fence shall be borne equally by the respective owners of those lands:

Provided that the fence shall be of such material and specifications as are reasonable having regard to all the circumstances, including the financial position of the parties.

Liability for
negligence.

3. Any loss, injury or damage howsoever occasioned suffered by one party due to, or arising out of, the failure or negligence of the other to carry out his obligations under section 2 shall be recoverable in an action for damages in a court of competent jurisdiction.
