"and keep a written record of".

 - (a) containing any matter inviting or inducing the public to vote, or not to vote, in favour of a particular candidate or group of candidates; or
 - (b) setting out political or other opinions entertained or supposed to be entertained by a candidate or group of candidates."; and
 - (c) in subsection (3) by repealing "either subsection (1) or (2)" and substituting "subsections (1), (2) or (2A)".
- 4. Section 73(1) is amended by repealing "and shall not communicate, except for some purpose authorised by law, to any person any information as to the name or number on the list of voters of any voter who has or has not applied for a ballot paper or voted at that polling station".
- 5. The 3rd Schedule and the Appendix thereto are amended in Form B by repealing "Amanuensis" wherever it appears and substituting "Person who assists an Applicant".

A LAW TO AMEND THE ELECTIONS LAW (1995 REVISION)
