FOREIGN JUDGMENTS RECIPROCAL ENFORCEMENT (AUSTRALIA AND ITS EXTERNAL TERRITORIES) ORDER 1993

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Governor in Council by section 3(1) of the Foreign Judgments Reciprocal Enforcement Law (Revised) the following Order is made --

Citation

1. This order may be cited as the Government Fees Order 1993.

Application

2. Part 1 of the Foreign Judgments Reciprocal Enforcement Law (Revised) shall apply to Australia and to the external territories of Australia.

Superior Courts

3. For the purpose of Part 1 of the Foreign Judgments Reciprocal Enforcement Law (Revised) the following courts shall be deemed to be superior courts of Australia and its external Territories —
