

5. The principal Law is amended by inserting the following new section immediately after section 14 —

“Temporary
licences.

14A. (1) In addition to the other sessions of the Board held pursuant to subsection (1) of section 6 and to subsection (1) of section 14, a Board shall also meet at any time and place to be appointed by the Chairman and published in the Gazette or in a newspaper printed in the Islands at least fourteen days before the meeting to hear any application on grounds of hardship or inconvenience for the grant of a temporary licence to permit the sale of intoxicating liquor on or off licensed premises in the manner therein mentioned.

(2) An applicant shall attend before the Board at the meeting and may in addition be represented by a person qualified to practice law in the Islands.

(3) Before granting a temporary licence under subsection (1), a Board may require such notice to be given, cause such enquiries to be made, and require to be produced by any person such information or certificate, as it shall consider desirable.

(4) A temporary licence granted under subsection (1) shall take effect immediately and shall remain in force, unless revoked or varied in the meantime, only until the next following annual or quarterly session of a Board to be held under subsection (1) of section 6 or under subsection (1) of section 14 (whichever is the earlier) and shall be subject to such terms and conditions as the Board shall impose.

(5) No application shall be made more than once in every two years by the same licensee in respect of the same premises.”.

**A LAW TO AMEND THE LIQUOR LICENSING LAW, 1974
(LAW 11 OF 1974)**

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Liquor Licensing (Amendment) (No. 2) Law, 1981.

Amendment of section
5 of Law 11 of 1974.

2. Section 5 of the Liquor Licensing Law, 1974, in this Law referred to as the principal Law, is amended by substituting “10” for “(10)” in the third line of subsection (10).

Amendment of section 10.

3. Section 10 of the principal Law is amended -

- (a) by substituting “six” for “five” in the first line of subsection (1);
- (b) by deleting “and” of the end of paragraph (d) of subsection (1);
- (c) by substituting “ ; and” for the fullstop at the end of paragraph (e) of subsection (1);
- (d) by adding the following new paragraph to subsection (1) —
“(f) temporary.”;
- (e) by substituting a semicolon for the fullstop at the end of paragraph (e) of subsection (2);
- (f) by adding the following new paragraph to subsection (2) —

“(f) permits the sale of intoxicating liquor temporarily and in the manner therein mentioned.”.

Amendment of section 12.

4. Section 12 is amended by inserting “(other than a temporary licence)” immediately after “ licence” in the first line of subsection (1).
