THE MARINE CONSERVATION LAW, 1978 (Law No. 19 of 1978)

THE MARINE CONSERVATION (TURTLE PROTECTION) **REGULATIONS, 1978**

Pursuant to the powers conferred on the Governor by section 24 of the Marine Conservation Law, 1978, the following Regulations are hereby made —

Citation.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Marine Conservation (Turtle Protection) Regulations, 1978.

Interpretation.

Law No. 19 of 1978.

2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires —

"Law" means the Marine Conservation Law, 1978;

"turtle" means any member of any of the marine species of the Phylum Chordata, Class Repitilia, Order Chelonia, including, but without in any way limiting the generality of the foregoing —

Chelonia mydas, the green turtle;

Eretmochelys imbricata, the hawksbill turtle;

Caretta caretta, the logger head turtle;

Dermochelys coriacea, the trunkback turtle: Cheionia depressa, the Australian sea turtle; and

Lepidochelys olivacea, the Ridley turtle; and

hybrids between these various species.

Prohibition on 3. Any person who has in his possession any turtle egg shall commit an of-

Provided, however, that nothing in this regulation shall apply to:-

- (a) the egg of any turtle bred in captivity by the holder of a licence granted under the Endangered Species Protection and Propagation Law. 1978: or
- (b) any egg taken in accordance with a licence issued by the Board under section 16 of the Law.

Disturbing etc., 4. Any person who attempts to take, disturb or molest in any way a female turtle at any time during the months of May, June, July, August or September months an offence. in any year shall commit an offence:

Provided that nothing in this regulation shall apply to anything done to a female turtle bred in capacity by the holder of a licence under the Endangered Law No. 21 of 1978. Species Protection and Propagation Law, 1978.
