CHAPTER 99

**Law 6 of
1931**

**MERCHANT SHIPPING (LIFE SAVING
APPLIANCES) LAW**

[14th December, 1931]

1. This Law may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Life Saving Appliances) Law. Short title.

2. Sections 427 to 431 of the Imperial Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, relating to Life Saving Appliances shall apply to all Foreign Ships while they are within any port in the Islands as they apply to British Ships, and a Surveyor of Ships appointed under section 727 of that Act shall have all the powers of the Surveyor of Ships referred to in section 431 thereof. Sections 427-431 of 57 and 58 Victoria Chapter 60, to apply to all Foreign Ships while in any port in the Islands.

Provided that any exemption granted by an Order in Council, issued under section 4 of the Imperial Act 6, Edward VII, Chapter 48, shall apply to the Islands.
