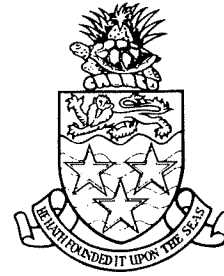

MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT 1970

THE MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT 1970 (UNREGISTERED SHIPS) REGULATIONS 1992

The Governor in Council in exercise of his powers under section 92 of the Merchant Shipping Act 1970 and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, makes the following Regulations—

Citation and
commencement.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Merchant Shipping Act 1970 (Unregistered Ships) Regulations 1992 and shall come into force on the 11th day of August 1992.

Extension to ships
entitled to be registered
of 24 metres or more in
length.

2. It is hereby directed that —

- (a) the provisions of the Merchant Shipping Act 1970 specified in column 1 of Schedule 1; and
- (b) the provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Repatriation)(Cayman Islands) Regulations 1989;

shall extend to ships (other than fishing vessels) of the following description, that is to say, sea-going ships —

- (i) of which a majority interest is owned by persons who are British Dependent Territory Citizens by virtue of a connection with the Cayman Islands or by a body corporate established under the law of the Cayman Islands and having a principal place of business in the Cayman Islands; and
- (ii) which are entitled to be registered in the Cayman Islands under the Merchant Shipping Act 1894 but are not registered, whether in the Cayman Islands or elsewhere; and
- (iii) which are 24 metres or more in length,

and to masters and seamen employed in them, with such exceptions, adaptations or modifications (if any) as are specified in column 2 of

Schedule 1.

Extension to ships
entitled to be registered
of less than 24 metres in
length.

3. It is hereby directed that –

- (a) the provisions of the Merchant Shipping Act 1970 specified in column 1 of Schedule 2; and
- (b) the provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Repatriation)(Cayman Islands) Regulations 1989 (except regulations 8 to 10);

shall extend to ships (other than fishing vessels) of the following description, that is to say, sea-going ships –

- (i) of which a majority interest is owed by persons who are British Dependent Territory Citizens by virtue of a connection with the Cayman Islands or a body corporate established under the law of the Cayman Islands and having a principal place of business in the Cayman Islands; and
- (ii) which are entitled to be registered in the Cayman Islands under the Merchant Shipping Act 1894 but are not registered, whether in the Cayman Islands or elsewhere; and
- (iii) which are less than 24 metres in length, and to masters and seamen employed in them, with such exceptions, adaptations and modifications (if any) as are specified in column 2 of Schedule 2.

Where –

- a) any person dies in a ship of the description contained in regulation 3; or
- b) the master of or a seaman employed in such ship dies in a country outside the Cayman Islands;

an inquiry into the cause of death shall be held only if the Governor in Council so directs.
