A LAW TO AMEND THE MONEY SERVICES LAW, 2000 TO MAKE PROVISION FOR LICENCE FEES TO BE PAID TO THE CAYMAN ISLANDS MONETARY AUTHORITY; AND TO MAKE PROVISION FOR RELATED MATTERS

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1. (1) This Law may be cited as the Money Services (Amendment) Law, 2002.

Short title and commencement

- (2) This Law shall come into force on such date as may be appointed by order made by the Governor.
- 2. The Money Services Law 2000 is amended in section 5 as follows -
 - (c) by inserting after subsection (9) the following subsection -
 - " (9A) Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions of this section, if the annual fee referred to in subsection (9) is not paid by the holder of a licence on or before every 15th day of January after the first grant of the licence, the unpaid annual fee may be sued for by the Crown by action as a civil debt and the Crown may require, and the court may order, the payment of any penalties accrued in respect of the late payment of the fee."; and
 - (d) by inserting after subsection (10) the following subsection -
 - " (11) In subsection (9A), "court" means the Grand Court or a court of summary jurisdiction, as the case may be.".
