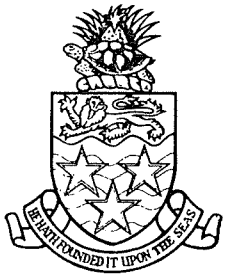

REGULATIONS 1995**

The Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 27 of the Civil Aviation Authority of the Cayman Islands Law, 1987 (a), and on the recommendation of the Civil Aviation Authority of the Cayman Islands, makes the following Regulations –

Title and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Airports (Security Tax) (Amendment) Regulations 1995 and shall come into force on 1st February 1995.

Increase in security tax

2. Regulation 3 of the Airports (Security Tax) Regulations, 1985, is amended by revoking the words "two dollars" and substituting the words "three dollars".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

A change in security policy has determined that the airport should be responsible for the screening of departing passengers and their hand luggage at international airports in the Cayman Islands.

This involves the provisions of personnel normally provided by airline officials and of additional equipment to ensure tighter security to restricted areas at the airports. Since this service has historically been provided by the carriers, little, if any, increase in cost to airline passengers is anticipated.
