A Law to Amend The Aliens Law (CAP. 3)
ENACTED by The Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1. This Law may be cited as The Aliens (Amendment) Law, 1970 and shall come into operation on a day to be appointed by the Administrator by Government Notice published in the Cayman Islands.

Short title and commencement.

- 2. Section 8 of The Aliens Law is hereby amended as follows:-
- Amendment of section 8 of Cap. 3.
- (a) by substituting the words "One Hundred and Fifty Jamaican dollars" for the words "Fifty Pounds" occurring in paragraph (a) of section (1) thereof;
- (b) by substituting the words "Four Hundred Jamaican dollars" for the words "Seventy Pounds" occurring in paragraph (b) of subsection (1) thereof;
- (c) by substituting the words "Six Hundred Jamaican

dollars" for the words "One Hundred Pounds" occurring in paragraph (c) of subsection (1) thereof.
