A LAW TO AMEND THE BAIL LAW (2007 REVISION) TO MAKE PROVISION FOR THE IMPOSITION BY A POLICE OFFICER OF ELECTRONIC MONITORING AS A CONDITION OF BAIL WHERE CURFEW IS A CONDITION OF BAIL; AND FOR INCIDENTAL AND CONNECTED PURPOSES

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1. This Law may be cited as the Bail (Amendment) Law, 2010.

2. The Bail Law (2007 Revision) is amended in section 2 by inserting, in the appropriate alphabetical sequence, the following definitions -

" "electronic monitoring" means surveillance utilizing an electronic device attached to a person, usually by means of an ankle bracelet, allowing the person's location to be monitored and his position and the electronic device's current status to be reported back to a central location;

"police officer" means a police officer within the meaning of the Police Law (2006 Revision) being of the rank of sergeant and above;". Short title
