THE CINEMATOGRAPH LAW [Cap. 18]

THE CINEMATOGRAPH [AMENDMENT] RULES, 1966

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Authority by section 8 of the Cinematograph Law (Cap. 18), the following Rules are hereby made with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly:—

- 1. The Rules may be cited as the Cinematograph (Amendment) Rules, 1966 and shall come into operation on a day to be appointed by the Administrator by Government Notice published in the Cayman Islands.
- 2. The Cinematograph Rules, 1964 (hereinafter referred to as the principal rules) are hereby amended by deleting rule (d) and substituting the following therefor -
 - "(d) The fee for an annual licence shall be £5, with discretion for the Authority to waive this fee in whole or in part where the applicant for such licence is a mission, educational or welfare organisation. The fee for a six (6) month licence shall be £2.10.0. The fee for a special licence shall be 10/- but at the discretion of the Authority this fee may be waived."
- 3. The principal rules are hereby amended by deleting rule (n) and substituting the following therefor -
 - "(n) Except where a cinema is constructed of concrete not less than two fire extinguishers in good and efficient working condition shall be kept on each floor of the auditorium. Where a cinema is constructed of concrete it shall be sufficient to keep one fire extinguisher in good and efficient working condition beside the projector. The cinema staff shall be trained in the use of fire extinguishers. Beside every fire extinguisher shall be placed four buckets, two containing sand and two containing water. Notwithstanding the above precautions, cinema owners shall fulfil such other

requirements as may be prescribed by the Firemaster of the Cayman Islands acting on behalf of the Authority."
