**A LAW TO AMEND THE COAT OF ARMS, FLAG AND NATIONAL
SONG LAW (1998 REVISION) TO ENABLE THE CHARGING OF FEES
FOR THE USE OF THE COAT OF ARMS OR FLAG IN CONNECTION
WITH A BUSINESS; AND FOR INCIDENTAL AND CONNECTED
PURPOSES**

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1. This Law may be cited as the Coat of Arms, Flag and National Song (Amendment) Law, 2002. Short title

2. The Coat of Arms, Flag and National Song Law (1998 Revision), in this Law referred to as “the principal Law”, is amended by inserting immediately after section 3, the following section - Insertion of section 4 in the Coat of Arms, Flag and National Song Law (1998 Revision) – regulations

“Regulations

4. The Governor in Council may make regulations -

- (a) prescribing the fees payable in respect of the use of the Coat of Arms or flag of the Islands pursuant to authority granted under section 2 (irrespective of whether the authority was granted before, on or after the date of

commencement of the Coat of Arms, Flag and National Song (Amendment) Law, 2002)

;

(b) prescribing the circumstances under which fees prescribed under paragraph (a), may be abated or waived; and

(c) for the better carrying out of this Law.”.

Savings and transitional provisions

3. (1) On and after the date of commencement of this Law, every existing authority shall continue in force on the same terms and conditions and with the same effect as obtained immediately before that date but the use of the Coat of Arms or flag of the Islands pursuant to any existing authority shall be subject to the payment of such fees (if any) as may be payable pursuant to regulations made under section 4 of the principal Law.

(2) In this section -

“existing authority” means any authority granted under section 2 of the principal Law and in force immediately before the date of commencement of this Law.
