THE CORONER'S COURT [EVIDENCE] RULES, 1979

Pursuant to section 24 of the above Law the following Rules are hereby made.

Citation.

1. These Rules may be cited as the Coroner's Court (Evidence) Rules, 1979.

Interpretation.

2. In these Rules -

"Law" means the Coroner's Law, 1975; and

"section" means a section of the Law.

Procedure in recording testimony at inquests.

- 3. In the exercise of his duty of recording evidence under subsection (1) of section 9 the Coroner
 - (a) is not restricted from recording and taking into account evidence on the ground that it would not be admissible at common law, or under the Evidence Law, 1978;
 - (b) may allow cross-examination of any witness by any person present in court desiring to cross-examine; and
 - (c) shall permit any person present in court to testify who desires so to do and states that his testimony may throw light upon the subject matter of the inquest.
- 4. The Coroner's signature shall be judicially recognized in all Courts.
