A LAW TO AMEND THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE CODE (1995 REVISION) TO PROVIDE FOR THE ABOLITION OF THE DEATH PENALTY; AND FOR INCIDENTAL AND CONNECTED PURPOSES

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1. This Law may be cited as the Criminal Procedure Code (Amendment) (Abolition of the Death Penalty) Law, 2000.

Short title

2. The Criminal Procedure Code (1995 Revision) is amended in the First Schedule in column 5 opposite section 46 (Treason by the Law of England) and section 47 (Instigating treason) by repealing the word "Death" and substituting "Imprisonment for life" in both cases.
