A LAW TO AMEND THE CUSTOMS LAW, 1990

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1. This Law may be cited as the Customs (Amendment) Law, 1993 and shall come into force on the 6th day of December, 1993.

2. The Customs Law, 1990 is amended by inserting after section 10 the following section-

" Regulations.

10A. (1) The Governor in Council may by regulations make such provision as he thinks necessary or expedient for prohibiting or regulating the import or export of all goods or of any class or description of goods.

(2) The power of the Governor in Council

Amendment to the Customs Law, 1990 (Law 17 of 1990).

to make regulations under subsection (1) includes power-

- (a) to make different provision in relation to different classes or description of goods, or in relation to goods of the same class or description in the same or different circumstances;
- (b) to make different provision in relation to different cases or classes of case (including different provision for different areas or different classes of business);
- (c) to provide for such exceptions, limitations and conditions, and to make such supplementary, incidental, consequential or transitional provisions, as the Governor in Council considers necessary or expedient; and
- (d) to apply, with modifications and adaptations, any other enactment (including one contained in this Law) that deals with matters which, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, are similar to those being dealt with by the regulations.

Passed by the Legislative Assembly the 3rd day of December, 1993.
