A LAW TO AMEND THE CUSTOMS LAW (2007 REVISION) TO MAKE PROVISION FOR CUSTOMS OFFICERS ASSIGNED TO THE ROYAL CAYMAN ISLANDS POLICE FORCE TO CARRY ARMS; AND FOR INCIDENTAL AND CONNECTED PURPOSES

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1. This Law may be cited as the Customs (Amendment) Law, 2009. Short title
2. The Customs Law (2007 Revision) is amended in section 2 by inserting after the definition of the word “apron” the following definition - Amendment of section 2 of the Customs Law (2007 Revision) – definitions

“ “arms” means firearms as defined in the Firearms Law (2008 Revision), and includes batons and handcuffs;”.
3. The Customs Law (2007 Revision) is amended in section 11 as follows - Amendment of section 11 of the Customs Law (2007 Revision) – law enforcement
 - (a) in subsection (3) by deleting the word “An” and substituting the words “Subject to subsection (4), an”; and
 - (b) by inserting after subsection (3) the following subsections -

“(4) Where an officer is assigned to perform duties with the Royal Cayman Islands Police Force, that officer may, with the

authority of the Collector and the Commissioner of Police, carry arms in the performance of those duties.

(5) For the purposes of subsection (4), the authority of the Collector and the Commissioner of Police shall be given under and in accordance with the general or special directions of the Governor.”.
