A LAW to Amend the Deportation (British Subjects) Law, 1941

B<sup>E</sup> it enacted by the Assembly of Justices and Vestry of the Cayman Islands as follows:—

Γ

1—This Law may be cited as the Deportation (British Short title and Construction. Subjects) (Amendment) Law, 1944, and shall be read and construed as one with the Deportation (British Subjects)

Law, 1941, hereinafter referred to as the principal Law.

Law 10 of 1941.

2—Sub-section (3) of section 2 of the principal Law is Amendment of hereby amended by the deletion of the word "Governor" sub-section (3) of section 2 of from the eighth line of the sub-section, and by the sub-the principal stitution therefor of the words "Secretary of State".

3—Sub-section (2) of section 7 of the principal Law is Amendment of hereby amended by the deletion of the word "Governor" sub-section (2) of section 7 of the principal the principal stitution therefor of the words "Secretary of State".

[No. 7] The Deportation (British Subject) (Amendment) Law, 1944

Amendment of section 9 of the principal Law.

4—Section 9 of the principal Law is hereby amended in the following respects:—

- (a) by the deletion of the word "Judge" from the fifth line of the section, and by the substitution therefor of the word "Magistrate";
- (b) by the deletion of the word "Governor" from the ninth line of the section, and by the substitution therefor of the word "Secretary of State".

Repeal and replacement of section 19 of the principal Law.

5—Section 19 of the principal Law is hereby repealed, and the following section substituted therefor:—

"19—The Commissioner shall forthwith report to the Secretary of State every order made by him under this Law and the grounds thereof and the proceedings thereunder.
