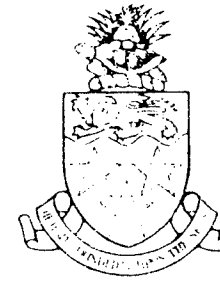

**DIRECTIONS (NO. 2) TO THE CAYMANIAN PROTECTION
BOARD**

The Directions given to the Caymanian Protection Board on 5th February, 1985, and published in the Extraordinary Gazette dated 27th March, 1985, are amended by inserting the following new directions immediately after direction 11 -

“11A. In the case of an application made under section 25 of the Law in respect of an attorney at law, the following further provisions apply -

- (a) the Board shall consult with the Attorney General;
- (b) the Board shall establish a policy of not giving a partner of a firm any greater security of tenure than any of its employees;
- (c) the Board shall ensure that no licence is granted if the result would be to create a situation whereby the legal profession became dominated by one or two firms;
- (d) the Board shall notify the Attorney General of every licence applied for or granted;
- (e) no licence shall be granted, except in exceptional circumstances, to persons wishing to enter into self-employment;
- (f) no licence shall be issued to any person who is not ordinarily resident in the Islands or who does not intend to be so ordinarily resident.
