DIRECTIONS (NO. 6) TO THE CAYMANIAN PROTECTION BOARD

1. The Protection Board shall be constituted as follows:—

(a) The Governor shall be the Chairman of the Board.

THE CAYMANIAN PROTECTION LAW, 1984

(Sections 27 (1) and 71 (3))

**DIRECTIONS (NO. 6) TO THE
CAYMANIAN PROTECTION BOARD**

The Directions given to the Caymanian Protection Board on 5th February, 1985, and published in the Extraordinary Gazette dated 27th March, 1985 (as amended from time to time) are further amended by --

- (a) inserting "and unless the Board considers such regulation not to be appropriate in any particular case" immediately after "1987" in the third line of direction 1A;
- (b) inserting "probationary term of three months extendable thereafter at the request of the employer to a" immediately before "single" in the fifth line of direction 1C (1);
- (c) substituting "six months" for "one year" in the second line of direction 1C (2)(c);
- (d) substituting a colon for the fullstop at the end of direction 1C (2) and by adding the following proviso --
"Provided that the Board may, in exceptional circumstances relating to any particular case, renew such a licence,";
- (e) substituting the following new direction for direction 4 --

"4. Persons married to Caymanians, or persons who are descended from Caymanians (which latter class of persons is deemed to include all persons who ceased to possess or enjoy Caymanian Status immediately on reaching the age of 18 years due to the provisions of section 21 (1)(e)(iii) of the repealed Caymanian Protection Law (Revised), shall be given preferential treatment in obtaining gainful occupation licences. In the case of an application from a person married to a Caymanian, the Board shall take into account whether the spouses are separated or living apart

and, if they are, all the circumstances thereof and the amount of maintenance paid, and whether the applicant (being male) will have an occupation to provide sufficient income to support a spouse and family. In the case of an application from a person descended from Caymanians, the Board shall take into account whether the applicant will have an occupation to provide sufficient income to support the applicant, spouse and any members of the applicant's family. In the case of all applications under this direction, the Board shall also take into account the desirability of granting gainful occupation licences to applicants with different backgrounds and from different geographical areas, to maintain a suitable balance in the social and economic life of the Islands:

Provided that in its relation to an application from a person married to a Caymanian, this direction does not apply if the Board has reason to believe that settlement in the Islands was the main motive of the marriage.";

(f) inserting the following new direction immediately after direction 16 --

"16A. Notwithstanding the generality of directions 15 and 16 in their relation to persons descended from Caymanians, the Board shall, unless it considers there are exceptional circumstances why it should not be granted, grant Caymanian Status to any applicant who, having under section 21 (1)(e)(iii) of the repealed Caymanian Protection Law (Revised) ceased to possess or enjoy such status on reaching the age of 18 years, was ordinarily resident in the Islands immediately before reaching that age.".
