A LAW TO AMEND THE IMMIGRATION LAW (2003 REVISION); AND FOR INCIDENTAL AND CONNECTED PURPOSES

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1. (1) This Law may be cited as the Immigration (Amendment) (No. 2) Law, 2003.

Short title and commencement

- (2) This Law comes into force on the date it is passed by the Legislative Assembly.
- 2. (1) The Immigration Law (2003 Revision) is amended in section 23 by repealing subsections (6) and (7) and substituting the following-

Amendment of section 23 of the Immigration Law (2003 Revision)procedure of Board in considering applications for grant

- "(6) Where an application for the grant of Caymanian status has been rejected prior to the date of commencement of this new Law, the applicant may at any time after the date of the communication of the decision to him make a further application for such a grant."
- 3. (1) Where a person has, prior to the date of the commencement of this new Law, made an appeal under section 22 (13) of the Immigration Law (2003 Revision) and such appeal has not been determined at the date of the commencement of this new Law, the person may discontinue such proceedings and make a further application in accordance with this new Law.

Savings and transitional provisions

- (2) Where a person discontinues an appeal the Immigration Appeals Tribunal may make such order for costs as it thinks just.
 - (3) In this Law -

The Immigration (Amendment) (No.2) Law, 2003

"the Immigration Appeals Tribunal" means the Immigration Appeals Tribunal established under section 11 of the Immigration Law (2003 Revision); and

"the new Law" means the Immigration Law (2003 Revision) as amended by this Law.
