Government Notice 72 of 1972

Date of operation 14th April, 1972

1. By reason of the coming into operation (on the 22nd of January, 1972) of The Cayman Islands (Legislative Assembly - Extension of Duration) Order, 1971 (Statutory Instrument No. 100 of 1971), extending the maximum life of the Legislative Assembly to five years, it is necessary to substitute in the said Order the words "five years" for the words "three years" in paragraph 2 of the said Order.

2. It is hereby notified that the said Order, as amended, shall come into operation on the 14th day of April, 1972.

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

By virtue of subsection (2) of section 3 of the Judicature (Administration of Justice) Law, the Grand Court is normally limited to two sessions in each year in both its civil and criminal jurisdictions. This provision was no doubt intended to meet the situation when there was no judge of the Court resident in the Islands and it was necessary to bring a judge from Jamaica to take these bi-annual sessions. In any event, the rapid economic development of the Islands over the past years, and up to the present time, has resulted in a tremendous increase in the volume of work in the Court, and the delays consequent upon the fact that only two sessions are held each year are proving to be a serious embarrassment. This Law accordingly seeks to increase the number of sessions to six in each year.

1. This Law may be cited as the Judicature (Administration of Justice) (Amendment) Law, 1972 and shall come into operation on a day to be appointed by the Governor by Government Notice published in the Cayman Islands.

2. Subsections (2) and (3) of Section 3 of the Judicature (Administration of Justice) Law are hereby repealed and replaced by the following subsection:-

“(2) Grand Courts shall be held on the first Wednesday in the months of January, March, May, July, September and November in every year and shall continue until the business of the court is completed. In the event of the first day being a public holiday, the court shall be held on the next working day. On
