A LAW TO AMEND THE JUDICATURE LAW (1995 REVISION) TO INCREASE THE MAXIMUM FINE PAYABLE BY A JUROR WHO FAILS TO ANSWER A JURY SUMMONS; TO CHANGE THE ARRAY OF THE JURY IN THE TRIAL OF MONEY LAUNDERING OFFENCES; AND FOR INCIDENTAL AND CONNECTED PURPOSES

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1. This Law may be cited as the Judicature (Amendment) Law, 2001.

Short title

2. The Judicature Law (1995 Revision), in this Law referred to as "the principal Law", is amended in section 2 by inserting the following new definition in its appropriate alphabetical order-

Amendment of the Judicature Law (1995 Revision) - definitions

"money laundering offence" has the meaning ascribed to it in section 27 (7) of the Proceeds of Criminal Conduct Law (2001 Revision);".

2001 Revision

3. The principal Law is amended in section 11 by repealing the words "one hundred" and substituting the words "five hundred".

Amendment of section 11- summons to jurors for court sessions

4. The principal Law is amended in section 16-

Amendment of section 16 - number of jurors in criminal cases

(a) by inserting after subsection (1) the following subsection-

"(1a) On trials for money laundering offences, twelve jurors shall form the array."; and

(b) in subsection (3), by inserting after the word "one" the words "or in the case of money laundering offences, five,".

Amendment of section 20 - discharge of jury before verdict 5. The principal Law is amended in section 20(1)(b) by inserting after the word "one" the words "or in the case of a money laundering offence, five;".
