## MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

No provision is made for joint trials where adults and juveniles are jointly charged with criminal offences, and it is sought to remedy this.

A Law to provide for the joint trials of juveniles and adults.

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Juveniles (Joint Trial With Adults) Law.

Interpretation.

2. In this Law -

"adult" means a person who has attained the age of 17 years;

Law 16 of 1975.

"juvenile" has the meaning ascribed to it in the Juveniles Law; and "trial" includes committal proceedings as well as a trial in any appropriate court.

When juveniles may be jointly tried with adults. 3. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law, when a juvenile and an adult are jointly charged with any criminal offence the Judge of the Grand Court, upon application made to him in Chambers, may order a joint trial upon such terms and conditions as he may decide to impose having regard both to the welfare of the juvenile and the necessity of doing justice in the case.
