**LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY
(AMENDMENT) STANDING ORDERS, 1986**

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE CAYMAN ISLANDS
LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY (AMENDMENT) STANDING
ORDERS, 1986

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Legislative Assembly by subsection (1) of section 31 of the Constitution, the following Standing Orders have been made -

Citation and date of commencement.

Amendment of Standing Order 5.

Amendment of Standing Order 7.

1. These Standing Orders may be cited as the Legislative Assembly (Amendment) Standing Orders, 1986 and shall take effect on the date of their publication in the Gazette.
2. Standing Order 5 of the Legislative Assembly Standing Orders (Revised), in these Standing Orders referred to as the principal Standing Orders is amended, in paragraph (6), by inserting -

(a) “next” immediately after “candidates” in the sixth line; and

(b) “or vacancies” immediately after “vacancy” in the eighth line;.
3. Standing Order 7 of the principal Standing Orders is amended by substituting the following for paragraphs (3) and (4) -

“(3) When divisions are taken in the House and in Committees of the House, the minutes shall include the numbers abstaining and the numbers voting for and against the question and the names of Members so voting.

“(4) The Clerk shall prepare for each meeting a Business Paper or Business Papers containing the business for that meeting.”.

Amendment of
Standing Order 23.

4. Standing Order 23 of the principal Standing Orders is amended
by -

- (a) substituting “(4) A Member of the Government may decline to answer a question if an answer would, in the opinion of the Government, be contrary to the public interest.” for paragraph (4); and
- (b) deleting “save that no postponement shall be allowed” from the last two lines of paragraph (6).

Amendment of
Standing Order 41

5. Standing Order 41 of the principal Standing Orders is amended
by substituting -

- (a) “meeting” for “sitting” in the second line of paragraph (6);
and
- (b) “meeting or for ten days, whichever is the longer” for
“sitting” in the last line of paragraph (9).
