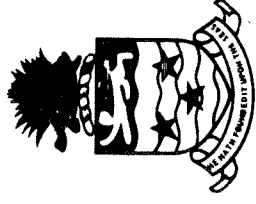

THE PLANTS (IMPORTATION AND TRANSPORTATION)  
(REGULATION) LAW  
(Revised)

Originally enacted 4th March, 1962

Short title. 1. This Law may be cited as the Plants (Importation and Transportation) (Regulation) Law (Revised).

Interpretation. 2. In this Law —  
“plant” includes any growing plant, cutting, bud, graft, bulb, root or seed, and also any fruit, or vegetable intended for propagation and not for consumption as food.

Importation or transportation without written permission an offence. (1) No person shall import into the Islands or transport from any one Island of them to another any plant without the written authority of the Governor or some person authorized by him.

(2) Whoever contravenes subsection (1) is guilty of an offence.

Power to prescribe condition of importation or transportation; breach of condition an offence. 4. The Governor or person authorized by him to grant the permission referred to in section 3 may, in granting such permission prescribe the conditions upon which the importation or transportation is permitted and whoever contravenes any such condition is guilty of an offence.

Power of Governor to order destruction of plants. 5. The Governor may at any time in writing direct that any plant imported into the Islands without the permission required by section 3, or any plant transported from any one Island of them to another without such permission, or any plant with respect to which any condition prescribed under section 4 has not been complied with to the satisfaction of the Governor, be destroyed.

Obstruction of police duties defined in section 5 an offence. 6. A constable may for the purpose of carrying out a direction under section 5 enter, by force if necessary, any place where such plant may be and whoever assaults, obstructs, hinders, or resists, or aids or incites any other person to assault, obstruct, hinder or resist any constable acting under this section is guilty of an offence.

Importation or transportation through certain parts. 7. (1) Any person who imports into the Islands or transports from any one Island of them to another any plant shall import or transport such plant through the port of George Town, Grand Cayman, or the port of Stake Bay, Cayman Brac.

(2) Any person who fails to comply with the provisions of subsection (1) shall be guilty of an offence against this Law.

Regulations. 8. The Governor may make regulations for carrying this Law into effect.

Penalty.

10. Whoever contravenes this Law is liable on summary conviction to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year or to a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars and in default of payment to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year, or both.
