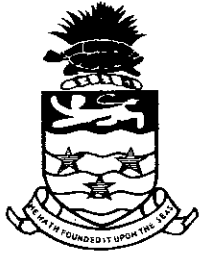

(No. 38 of 1967)

THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION LAW
(Revised)

- Short title.** 1. This Law may be cited as the Public Service Commission Law (Revised).
- Interpretation.** 2. In this Law, unless the context otherwise requires —
- “Commission” means the Public Service Commission created in section 5;
- “prescribed” means prescribed by this Law or any Regulation made hereunder;
- “public office” means any office of emolument in the public service;
- “public officer” means the holder of any public office and includes any person appointed to act in any such office; and
- “public service” means the service of the Crown in respect of the government of the Islands.
- Governor’s power.** 3. In exercise of all functions conferred on him by this Law the Governor shall not be obliged to consult with the Executive Council.
- Public officers.** 4. The appointment, promotion, transfer, dismissal or disciplinary control of public officers is hereby vested in the Governor.
- Creation of Public Service Commission.** 5. (1) There is established in and for the Islands a Public Service Commission which, subject to the provisions of subsection (3), consists of such persons, appointed in such manner, as may be prescribed.
- (2) The members of the Commission shall hold office upon such terms and conditions as may be prescribed, but the Governor may terminate any appointment at any time.
- (3) No Member of the Legislative Assembly may become or remain a member of the Commission at the same time.
- Functions of the Commission on 5.1. 1101 of 1972.** 6. (1) The Governor shall, save and except the matters specified in section 7 and section 54 (in so far as the latter section relates to the power to institute offices for the Islands) of the Cayman Islands (Constitution) Order, 1972, refer

to the Commission for their advice on any questions relating to the appointment (including promotion and transfer) or the dismissal or other disciplinary control of such public officers or to any such matters which, in his opinion, affect the public service to the extent prescribed.

(2) It is the duty of the Commission to advise the Governor of any question which he refers to it in accordance with subsection (1).

Power to make regulations.

7. The Governor in Council may make Regulations for giving effect to the provisions of this Law, and in particular and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing power may by such regulations make provision for all or any of the following matters, that is to say —

- (a) the membership of the Commission;
- (b) the appointment, tenure of office and terms of service of members of the Commission;
- (c) the organisation of the work of the Commission and the manner in which the Commission shall perform its functions;
- (d) consultation by the Commission with persons other than members of the Commission;
- (e) the appointment, tenure of office and terms of service of staff to assist the Commission in the performance of its functions;
- (f) the delegation to any member of the Commission of all or any of the powers or duties of the Commission;
- (g) the protection and privilege of members of the Commission in respect of the performance of their duties and privilege of communication to and from the Commission or its members in case of legal proceedings.
