SHIPS (RODENT CONTROL) REGULATIONS

(2003 Revision)

- These regulations may be cited as the Ships (Rodent Control) Regulations Citation (2003 Revision).
- In these regulations-

Definitions

"deratting certificate" and "deratting exemption certificate" mean a certificate in the form prescribed in the First Schedule;

"master" and "port" have the meanings ascribed to them in the Port Authority Law 1999 Revision (1999 Revision); and

"medical officer" means a government medical or other officer designated as such by the Chief Medical Officer for the purposes of these regulations.

(1) If the master of a ship, which during its voyage has been in a foreign Deratting and the issue port, cannot produce to a medical officer, at the place in the Islands where such ship arrives, a valid deratting certificate or deratting exemption certificate in respect of such ship, the medical officer shall -

- (a) if such ship has arrived at a port, require the ship to be inspected to ascertain whether it is kept in such a condition as to be free of rodents and the plague vector; or
- (b) if such ship is not in a port, direct the ship to proceed at its own risk to the nearest port at which a deratting certificate or deratting exemption certificate, as the case may be, can be obtained, there to be inspected.
- (2) If, after the ship has been inspected, the medical officer is satisfied that the ship is free from rodents and the plague vector, he shall issue a deratting exemption certificate.
- (3) If, after the ship has been inspected, such medical officer is not so satisfied, he shall require the ship to be deratted in a manner to be determined by him.
- (4) If the master produces a deratting certificate or a deratting exemption certificate, but the medical officer has evidence that the deratting was not satisfactorily completed, the medical officer may, notwithstanding such certificate, exercise, in relation to the ship, his powers under subregulation (3).

- (5) The master shall forthwith make arrangements for any deratting required by the medical officer.
- (6) When deratting has been completed to the satisfaction of the medical officer, he shall issue a deratting certificate.
- (7) Before the medical officer directs, under this regulation, that a ship shall proceed to a port, he shall consult with any customs officer present.

Issue of certificates after inspection

4. Upon receipt of an application in writing from the master of a ship for a deratting certificate or a deratting exemption certificate in respect of such ship, the medical officer shall take such steps as he considers necessary to satisfy himself that the ship is kept in such a condition as to be free of rodents and the plague vector, or give directions for the deratting of the ship, as the case may require, and, on being satisfied as to the condition of the ship or that the deratting has been has been properly carried out, he shall issue the appropriate certificate.

Filing of copy of certificate and payment of fees

- 5. (1) A copy of every such certificate issued under regulation 3 shall be retained by the Department of Public Health.
- (2) The master of a ship to be inspected under this regulation shall pay, to the health authority, the fee prescribed in the Second Schedule.
