THE TRADE AND BUSINESS LICENSING POLICY DIRECTIONS, 1998

The Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 7 of the Trade and Business Licensing Law (1996 Revision) issues the following policy directions to the Trade and Business Licensing Board for its guidance in the exercise of its powers, functions and duties under that Law-

1. These Directions may be cited as the Trade and Business Licensing Policy Directions, 1998.

Citation

2. Where an application for a licence has been made under section 4 of the Trade and Business Licensing Law (1996 Revision), and the Trade and Business Licensing Board is notified in writing by the Central Planning Authority or the Development Control Board that-

Notification by the Developments Control Board

- (a) the applicant has applied under section 12 of the Development and Planning Law (1995 Revision) for permission to develop land;
- (b) the application under the Development and Planning Law (1995 Revision) is connected with the application under section 4 of the Trade and Business Licensing Law (1996 Revision); and
- (c) the application for development has been referred to the Developments Advisory Board,

the Trade and Business Licensing Board shall not begin or complete, as the case may be, the consideration of the application under section 4 of the Trade and Business Licensing Law (1996 Revision) until it is notified in writing by the Central Planning Authority or the Development Control Board of the decision in respect of the application under the Development and Planning Law

(1995 Revision); and the Trade and Business Licensing Board in considering the application to it shall take into account the decision under the Development and Planning Law.
