| 1. This Law may be cited as the Traffic (Amendment) Law, 2001.   | Short title   |

The Traffic Law (2001 Revision), in this Law referred to as "the principal Law", is amended in section 2 in the definition "alcohol-in-breath measuring device" by repealing the words "prescribed for the purposes of the Law" and by inserting after the word "blood" the words "approved from time to time by the Commissioner in writing and published by notice in the Gazette". | Amendment of section 2 of the Traffic Law (2001 Revision) - definitions |
| 3. The principal Law is amended in section 74 (1) (a) by repealing the words "prescribed by the Governor" and substituting the words "approved from time to time by the Commissioner in writing and published by notice in the Gazette".   | Amendment of section 74 - provision of specimens for analysis           |
| 4. The principal Law is amended in section 96 by repealing paragraphs (b) and (c).   | Amendment of section 96 - regulations under this Part                   |
| 5. The Traffic (Radar Speedometer) Regulations, 2001 and the Traffic (Prescription of Measuring Devices) Order (1999 Revision) are repealed.   | Repeals   |
