**THE TRAFFIC (PUBLIC PASSENGER VEHICLES) (AMENDMENT)
REGULATIONS, 2013**

The Governor in Cabinet, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 52 and 142 of the Traffic Law, 2011, makes the following Regulations -

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Traffic (Public Passenger Vehicles) (Amendment) Regulations, 2013. Citation
2. The Traffic (Public Passenger Vehicles) Regulations, 2012 are amended in regulation 3(1) by repealing subparagraph (d) and substituting the following subparagraph - Amendment of regulation 3 of the Traffic (Public Passenger Vehicles) Regulations, 2012 - application for grant of permit

“(d) the application fee, except that an applicant who is a Caymanian shall be exempt from paying the application fee.”.
3. The Traffic (Public Passenger Vehicles) Regulations, 2012 are amended in regulation 4 as follows - Amendment of regulation 4 of the Traffic (Public Passenger Vehicles) Regulations, 2012 - conditions for grant of permit
 - (a) in paragraph (2) by repealing subparagraph (b) and substituting the following subparagraph -

“(b) has paid the application fee to the Board or is exempt from paying the application fee;”;
 - (b) by inserting after paragraph (3) the following paragraphs -

“ (3A) Where the applicant has a physical impairment which has a substantial adverse effect on his ability to carry out normal day to day activities, the Board shall provide adequate and appropriate facilities, accommodation and equipment to assist the applicant to undergo any test that he is required to undergo pursuant to paragraph (2)(i) or (3)(c).

(3B) For the purposes of paragraphs (2)(i) and (3)(c), in the case of an application for a permit, or for the renewal of a permit,

to drive a school vehicle, the Board shall not require the applicant to undergo -

- (a) a test of general local knowledge;
- (b) a test to demonstrate customer service related skills; or
- (c) a test of knowledge of tours for visitors to the Islands.”.
