TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

(2002 Revision)

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Traffic Regulations (2002 Revision). Citation
- (1) Forms required by the Law to be prescribed are set forth in the First Schedule hereto.
- (2) The form of driver's licence to be issued shall contain the following particulars
 - name and address of the applicant;
 - (b) date of birth of applicant;
 - (c) number of licence;
 - (d) dates of issue and expiry;
 - group codes; (e)
 - (f) signature of the holder;
 - photograph of the holder; (g)
 - issuing officer's signature; and (h)
 - stamp of issuing office,

and shall be printed upon a card of a size measuring not more than 3.25 inches by 2.5 inches which card shall be covered by laminated plastic.

(1) The official vehicles used by the Governor in person shall carry, in lieu Licence plates and of a licence plate, a crown or the coat of arms of the Islands.

coupons

- (2) The licence plates and coupons required by the Law are prescribed in the Second and Third Schedules.
- Driving and vehicle testing shall normally be carried out between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays other than public holidays at the Police Station, George Town and the Post Office, Cayman Brac and at such other times and places as the Commissioner may, by public notice, appoint.

Vehicle testing, places and times

(1) Such coupon shall be displayed at all times on the front windscreen within six inches of the edge thereof on the near side of the vehicle or, where no such windscreen is fitted to the vehicle, in the area where the windscreen would ordinarily be located, save that, in the case of trailers, the coupon shall be displayed on the near side back of the trailer; the licence plates or trade plates, as the case may be, shall be displayed at the front and rear of the vehicle, or at the rear only in the case of a trailer, so that the plate shall be parallel with the ground

Display of coupons and

and not more than thirty-six inches and not less than eight inches clear of the ground.

(2) Coupons and plates required to be displayed must be visible and readable at all times.

Age qualifications

- 6. The age qualifications for drivers of motor vehicles are-
 - (a) for driving a motor cycle of an engine seventeen years capacity not exceeding 125 cubic centimetres, a motor car, a station wagon or a rental car -
 - (b) for driving a truck not exceeding three ton eighteen years capacity
 - (c) for driving a motor cycle of an engine nineteen years capacity exceeding 125 cubic centimetres
 - (d) for driving any other vehicle eighteen years,

save that a person of any age, if permitted so to do by the Commissioner, may drive an invalid carriage.

Trade plates

7. The dimensions of trade plates shall be six inches in height and twelve inches or upwards in length with figures three inches in height or, in the case of motor cycles and invalid carriages, of such dimensions as may be approved by the Commissioner, from time to time.

"L" plates

8. The "L" plates required to be displayed by section 34(1) prescribed in the Fourth Schedule and shall be prominently displayed on the front and rear of every vehicle when, and only when, such vehicle is being driven by the holder of a provisional licence.

Driving test

9. (1) The following are the requirements for the passing of a driving test-

the applicant shall satisfy the examiner that he is capable of driving the class of vehicle in respect of which he is seeking a licence to drive and in particular that he can-

- (a) read in good daylight (with the aid of glasses if worn) a licence plate number fixed to a motor vehicle at a distance of sixty feet.
- (b) start the vehicle from rest smoothly and efficiently and maintain it on an accurate course as directed by the examiner;
- (c) make turns to the right and left with accuracy and without endangering other road users;
- (d) stop the vehicle smoothly and efficiently at various speeds and make emergency stops;
- (e) operate all the controls of the vehicle efficiently and with safety;

- (f) if the vehicle is capable of being reversed, drive and turn it in reverse accurately and smoothly;
- (g) stop and start the vehicle on gradients;
- turn the vehicle completely about by the use of forward and reverse gears within a reasonable compass;
- make such other normal manoeuvres as the examiner shall direct; and that
- (j) he is familiar with the road code and generally with the provisions of the Law, particularly sections 55 to 59, and

the applicant shall be required to pass a written examination to ascertain whether he has the knowledge required of him by paragraph (j) and to answer not less than eighty per cent of the questions correctly.

- (2) In the case of an application to ride a motor cycle with an engine capacity exceeding 125 cubic centimetres, in addition to the requirements of subregulation (1), the applicant shall produce to the examiner proof that he has held a full Group 1 licence for a motor cycle of an engine capacity not exceeding 125 cubic centimetres for a period of at least two years prior to his application.
- 10. The form of photograph prescribed for the purposes of the Law shall be unmounted and taken full face without a hat and of dimensions not more than 2 inches by 1.5 inches and not less than 1.5 inches by 1 inch.

Photographs

11. The prescribed uniform for school crossing patrols is a white dust coat or mackintosh with or without fluorescent jacket, sleeves or armbands.

School crossing patrol uniforms

12. (1) All vehicles used on the road other than special vehicles specifically exempted by the Commissioner shall be fitted with pneumatic tyres in sound condition and having a tread depth of at least one millimetre around the circumference of the tyre and across seventy-five per cent of its breadth, including any tyre on a spare wheel carried by the vehicle.

Tyres

- (2) Radial tyres shall not be mixed with other tyres on the same axle and, if fitted to the front axle, must be fitted all round (spare included).
- 13. Every vehicle other than a special vehicle specifically exempted by the Commissioner or a trailer of capacity not exceeding two shipping tons shall have two independent braking systems in good working order, one of which is capable of being operated while the vehicle is stationary, and one of which is capable of bringing the vehicle to a halt within fifty feet when travelling at twenty-five miles per hour

Brakes

14. (1) No mechanically propelled vehicle other than an emergency vehicle Lights shall be equipped with-

- (a) any external light of a colour other than white, red or amber;
- (b) any light other than a headlight or headlights which is capable of having its beam moved while the vehicle is in motion; or
- (c) any light other than headlights, stop lights, emergency lights or trafficators having an output in excess of seven watts.

(2) For the purposes of this regulation-

- (a) a headlight is a light carried at the front of a vehicle capable of being dipped to the left when the vehicle is in motion;
- (b) a sidelight is one of a pair of lights placed on each side of the front of a vehicle;
- (c) a rear light is a red light placed at the rear of a vehicle;
- (d) a stoplight is a red light placed at the rear of a mechanically propelled vehicle which becomes illuminated or the illumination of which becomes intensified when a brake of the vehicle is actuated, so as to be clearly visible by day and by night;
- (e) a reverse light is a light placed at the rear of a vehicle which becomes illuminated only when the vehicle is engaged in reverse gear;
- (f) an emergency light is a pulsating red or amber light designed to be used only for the purpose of giving warning of an emergency in connection with the vehicle to which it is fitted;
- (g) a reflector is a device for reflecting in red the beam of a light turned in its direction;
- (h) a registration plate light is a light illuminating the rear number plate of a vehicle at night time so as to render it readable at a distance of thirty feet; and
- (i) a trafficator is a pulsating or flashing light placed at each side of a vehicle the purpose of indicating that such vehicle is about to turn in the direction of the side where such light is made to flash and designed so as to be clearly visible by day as well as by night.
- (3) No red light of any kind shall be displayed at the front of any vehicle.
- (4) No white light of any kind other than a reverse light or a registration plate light shall be located at the rear of any vehicle.
- (5) Subject to regulation 23, no amber light of any kind other than a trafficator or emergency light shall be located or displayed so as to be visible from the rear of any vehicle.
- (6) No external light shall be carried less than eighteen inches or more than four feet above ground level on any vehicle unless specifically authorised by the Law or any regulation.

- (7) The following are the minimal lighting requirements for the vehicle to which reference is made-
 - (a) bicycles shall have one light fixed in front which may or may not be capable of being dipped to the left, one rear light attached to the aft side rear fork or a reflector visible from the rear, all so devised that the presence and movement of the bicycle shall be clearly visible at night time within a range of fifty yards;
 - (b) motorcycles shall have a head lamp in front and a rear light, reflector, stoplight and registration plate light at the rear;
 - (c) mechanically propelled vehicles other than motorcycles, invalid carriages and special vehicles shall have one pair of sidelights and not less than one or more than two pairs of headlights at the front, two rear lights, two reflectors, two stoplights placed on each side of the vehicle and a registration plate light at the rear and shall have trafficators so placed as to be clearly visible from the front and rear of the vehicle when in operation by night and by day; each pair of lights shall be of equal candle power;
 - (d) special vehicles and invalid carriages shall be equipped with such lights as, notwithstanding these regulations, the Commissioner may specifically require; and
 - (e) emergency vehicles shall be equipped with such additional lights as the Commissioner may specifically require and, in addition, may carry a blue rotating light in such a position as to give warning of their presence and of their movements in every direction.
- 15. Every bicycle shall be equipped with a hand operated bell and every mechanically propelled vehicle shall be equipped with means of giving audible warning of its presence but no mechanically propelled vehicle other than an emergency vehicle shall be equipped with any gong, bell, siren or any device capable of giving two or more different sounds in succession.

Horns, etc.

16. Every mechanically propelled vehicle shall be equipped with at least one driving mirror so placed that the person driving it shall have a clear view of traffic approaching from his rear.

Driving mirrors

17. Every vehicle propelled by an internal combustion engine shall be fitted with a silencer according to its manufacturer's standard design and no person shall make modification to such silencer so as in any way to increase the noise of escaping exhaust gas. Such silencers shall be maintained in a leakproof condition and in sound mechanical order.

Silencers, etc.

18. (1) A motor vehicle, every trailer drawn thereby and all parts and accessories of such vehicle and trailer shall at all times be in such condition, and

Unsafe loading, etc.

the number of passengers carried by such vehicle or trailer, the manner in which any passengers are carried in or on such vehicle or trailer, and the weight, distribution, packing and adjustment of the load of such vehicle or trailer shall at all times be such that no danger or nuisance is caused or is likely to be caused to any person.

- (2) The load carried by a motor vehicle or trailer, shall at all times be so secured, if necessary by physical restraint other than its own weight, and be in such a position, that neither danger nor nuisance is likely to be caused to any person or property by reason of the load or any part thereof falling or being blown from the vehicle or by reason of any other movement of the load or any part thereof in relation to the vehicle.
- (3) Whoever uses, causes or permits to be used on a road a motor vehicle or trailer in contravention of paragraphs (1) and (2) is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of two hundred dollars and to imprisonment for three months.

Speedometers

19. Every mechanically propelled vehicle capable of travelling under its own power at a speed in excess of fifteen miles per hour shall be fitted with a speedometer clearly visible to the driver and indicating to him the rate of travel of the vehicle in miles or kilometres per hour up to its maximum designed speed with an accuracy of not less than ninety per cent.

One way roads

- 20. (1) Subject to subregulation (3), no person shall use or drive any vehicle on any road mentioned in the Fifth Schedule otherwise than in the direction specified therein.
- (2) Whoever acts in contravention of this regulation is guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine of fifty dollars and to imprisonment for three months.
- (3) Nothing in subregulation (1) applies to anything done with the permission of a constable in uniform or other duly authorised person who may be engaged in the regulation of traffic or so as to prevent a vehicle complying with any direction of such a constable or person.

Speed limits

- 21. (1) Subject to subregulations (2) and (3), a maximum speed limit of twenty-five miles per hour is prescribed-
 - (a) for all roads in the area of West Bay to the North of grid line 2141200mN;
 - (b) for all roads in the area of George Town bounded on the North by grid line 2135000mN and on the West by the sea;

- (c) along the throughway A2 passing through Bodden Town from the western boundary of Parcel 38C14 (area of Ornon Whittaker's residence, map reference 726311 to the East of Pease Bay, grid line 475050mE;
- (d) along the throughway A3, passing through East End from grid line 487440mE to a point adjacent to Parcel 74A24 map reference 909364 (in the area of Trailer House);
- (e) for Manse Road B17 from Guard House Corner map reference 732309 to where the road ends at map reference 728306;
- (f) for the feeder road B18, from Old Man Bay map reference 815388 to Little Spot Point map reference 824392;
- (g) for Newlands Road from its junction with the throughway A2 at map reference 687309 to where the road ends at map reference 677334;
- (h) for Heath Bay Road from its junction with the throughway A2 at map reference 713314 to where the road ends at map reference 708299;
- for the Old Prospect Road B16 from its junction with throughway A2 at Red Bay Plaza map reference 640317 to its junction with the Bodden Town Road at map reference 651311;
- (j) for the Pedro Castle Road from the throughway A2 map reference 687309 to Pedro Castle, Old Jones Bay and easterly to Parcel 32E24 map reference 698299;
- (k) for the East End Interior Road from throughway A3 at map reference 857332 thence northerly to where the road ends at map reference 857368;
- for all other roads in the Island of Grand Cayman not being throughways; and
- (m) for all roads in Little Cayman.
- (2) Subject to subregulation (3), a maximum speed limit of thirty miles per hour is prescribed for-
 - (a) North West Point Road B12, from the junction of Town Hall Road map reference 576418 to a point beyond the Turtle Farm map reference 563431;
 - (b) North Sound Road B11, from the junction of Mount Pleasant Road, map reference 585425 to Jackson's Barcadere where the road ends, map reference 599424;
 - (c) South Church Street B8, from the southern boundary of Parcel 14BJ13 map reference 594331 to the junction of Walkers Road, map reference 593304;
 - (d) Smith Road B7, for its entire length, from the junction of Hospital Road, map reference 599329 to the junction of Crewe Road, map reference 612372;

- (e) Eastern Avenue Al, for its entire length from the junction of Crewe Road, map reference 604335 to the junction of West Bay Road, map reference 597346;
- (f) Crewe Road A2, from the junction of Eastern Avenue, map reference 604335 to the junction of Tropical Gardens, map reference 630325;
- (g) South Sound Road A5, from the junction of Walkers Road, map reference 593304 to the junction of the Bodden Town Road at Red Bay, map reference 635318;
- (h) Walkers Road A5, from map reference 593312 (a point beyond the Catholic School) to the junction of South Sound Road, map reference 593304;
- (i) throughway A2, passing through Savannah between grid lines 467660mE and 469040mE;
- (j) throughway A2, passing through Breakers between grid lines 478400mE and 479500mE;
- (k) throughway A4 at North Side, from a point adjacent to the Hideaway Bar on grid line 2138680mN to Grape Tree Point, grid line 476300mE;
- (1) throughway A4, from Parcel 39E13, map reference 733403 to Rum Point, map reference 715418 where the road ends, and from the throughway A4 map reference 715418 to Water Cay and Sandie Pointe, map reference 706400 and 712411 respectively; and
- (m) Hutland Road Bl9 from its junction with the throughway A4 at map reference 776396 to where the road forks at map reference 774391, thence easterly along the track to Parcel 49A22 map reference 782384.
- (3) Subject to subregulation (4), a maximum speed limit of forty miles per hour is prescribed-
 - (i) for the West Bay Road from grid line 2141200mN to grid line 2135000mN;
 - (ii) for the throughway A2 from the junction of Crewe Road and Tropical Gardens, map reference 630325 to Savannah at grid line 467660mE; and
 - (iii) from Savannah at grid line 469040mE to the Western boundary of Parcel 38C14 at Bodden Town, map reference 726311.
- (4) The speed limits prescribed in subregulations (1) and (2) are without prejudice to any lower limits imposed upon any class of vehicle by virtue of the principal Law or these regulations.

Prescribed radar speed meters

22. The following are prescribed types of radar speed meters-

- (a) the Marconi portable electronic traffic analyser;
- (b) the Electro-matic radar speed manufactured by the Automatic Signal Division of the Laboratory for Electronics, Norwalk, Conn., U.S.A.;
- (c) the device called the Visual Average Speed Computer and Recorder manufactured by the Federal Sign and Signal Corporation of Blue Island, Illinois, U.S.A., commonly known as VASCAR; and
- (d) the Doppler digital radar speed gun and the Doppler digital radar speed gun 8, both manufactured by CMI Inc., Minturn, Colorado, U.S.A.
- 23. (1) Every vehicle carrying an overhanging load shall mark such load-

Overhanging loads

- (a) by day, with a red flag at least one foot by one foot in size at each point where such load projects outside the profile of the vehicle; and
- (b) by night, with a white light to the front, a red light to the rear and an amber light to the sides at each point where such load projects beyond the profile of the vehicle.
- (2) Where the overhanging load projects beyond three feet over either side of the vehicle, such vehicle shall not move unless accompanied by a police escort at such time and date as the Commissioner shall order after he has been requested so to do by not less than forty-eight hours notice in writing.
- 24. (1) The Governor may, on the advice of the Commissioner, disapprove of any crash helmet, driving mirror, windscreen wiper, horn, light, speedometer or other piece of equipment for use on a vehicle if it appears that such piece of equipment is-

Disapproval of accessories

- (a) unsafe
- (b) likely to be a nuisance to the public; or
- (c) inadequate for the purpose for which it appears to be intended,

and such disapproved piece of equipment shall not be used or carried in or annexed to any vehicle, neither shall it be imported into or sold in the Islands for use with a vehicle.

- (2) Every vehicle imported into or used in the Islands which would otherwise be likely to cause interference with radio reception by the public shall be equipped with effective radio interference suppressors.
- (3) Anything affixed to, or built into, the windscreen or any window of a motor vehicle whereby the degree of light transmission in either direction is diminished below that which is specified in paragraph (b) is declared to be unsafe,

and, for the purpose of paragraph (a) of subregulation (1), is expressly disapproved:

Provided that -

- (a) the front windscreen of a vehicle, which shall be of clear glass, may have, at the top thereof, a strip of tinted glass of any degree of light transmission, not exceeding four inches in width measured from the top of the windscreen;
- (b) all windows shall, if tinted, allow a minimum of thirty-five per cent of light transmission when measured by the measuring device referred to in subregulation (4) whether the glass is tinted by the manufacturer thereof or by any other person.
- (4) The degree of light transmission shall be determined by a measuring device known as the Mars Window Trans-meter which is hereby approved for the measurement of light passing through the glass windows of motor vehicles.
- (5) Whoever, in any vehicle, carries any device or thing, not being part of the normal equipment of that vehicle, which is capable of impeding, balking or frustrating the purpose of any radar speed meter as defined in section 63(3) or the mechanical or running, efficiency of any police equipment or vehicle, commits an offence.

Tow ropes

- 25. Where any driver of a vehicle uses a tow rope for the purpose of towing another vehicle, such tow rope-
 - (a) shall not exceed fifteen feet in length; and
 - (b) shall be marked with pieces of red cloth or by some other means so as to render it clearly visible to other road users.
- 26. (1) The fees set out in subregulations (2) to (5) are prescribed in connection with inspection, registration, licensing and items under the law.

(6) In subregulation (4)-

"motor car" means a mechanically propelled vehicle, not being a motor cycle or invalid carriage, which is constructed solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects and is adapted to carry not more than seven passengers exclusive of the driver.

- (7) The Governor in Council may, from time to time, waive or reduce any or all of the fees and duties specified in subregulations (2) to (4) in relation to any person or group of persons in Cayman Brac or Little Cayman.




