A LAW to Amend the Music and Dancing (Licensing)
Law, 1963.

()

Enacted by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1—This Law may be cited as the Music and Dancing (Licensing) (Amendment) Law, 1964, and shall be read and construed as one with the Music and Dancing (Licensing) Law, 1963, and all amendments thereto, hereinafter referred to as the principal Law.

Short title and construction.

Law 14 of 1963.

2—The principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion of a new section, Section 13 as follows -

Insertion of new section to principal Law.

“Offence for
persons to
consume li-
quor upon
licensed
premises

13 - (1) It shall not be lawful for any person to consume intoxicating liquor as defined in Section 2 of the Liquor Licensing Law, 1955, Law 4 of 1955, in or upon any building or place licensed under the provisions of this Law, unless such building or place is already licensed for the consumption of such intoxicating liquor.

(2) Any person which expression shall include the owner or manager of such building or place who consumes or allows to be consumed any such intoxicating liquor in or upon such building or place shall be liable on summary conviction before the Stipendiary Magistrate to a fine not exceeding ten pounds, and in default thereof to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month.”.
