A LAW to Amend the Customs Consolidation Law, 1897.

()

Enacted by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1— This Law may be cited as the Customs Consolidation (Amendment) Law, 1965, and shall be read and construed as one with the Customs Consolidation Law, 1897, hereinafter referred to as the principal Law, and all amendments thereto, and shall come into operation on a day to be published by the Administrator by Government Notice in the Cayman Islands.

2— Section 8 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the deletion and replacement of sub-section (2) as follows:-

2 (No. 22) *The Customs Consolidation (Amendment) Law, 1965.*

“In all amounts of duty to be paid on goods imported into the Cayman Islands, the Collector of Customs shall, where the goods are not insured, apply an insurance value of 1 per cent of the prior cost of the goods.”
