A LAW to Amend the Diplomatic Agent (Immunity from
Legal Process) Law, 1964.

()

Enacted by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1— This Law may be cited as the Diplomatic Agent
(Immunity from Legal Process) (Amendment) Law, 1965,
hereinafter referred to as the principal Law, and all
amendments thereto, and shall come into operation on a
day to be published by the Administrator by Government
Notice in the Cayman Islands.

Amendment of short title of principal Law.

2— The words “Diplomatic Agent (Immunity from Legal Process) Law” appearing at the top of the principal Law are hereby deleted and the following words substituted therefor “DIPLOMATIC PRIVILEGES AND IMMUNITIES LAW”.

Amendment of Section 1 of principal Law.

3— Section 1 of the principal Law is hereby amended by deleting the words “Diplomatic Agent (Immunity from Legal Process) Law” and substituting therefor the words “DIPLOMATIC PRIVILEGES AND IMMUNITIES LAW”.

Addition of a new Section.

4— A new Section, Section 5, shall be added to the principal Law as follows:-

“Law of Colony relating to privileges of sovereigns and others assimilated to the Law of England.

5— Notwithstanding any provisions to the contrary contained in the law applicable to these Islands, the law and custom relating to the immunities and privileges as to person, property or servants of sovereigns, diplomatic agents, or the representatives of foreign powers for the time being in force in England shall, in so far as the same is applicable mutatis mutandis, have effect and be enforced in these Islands.”
