A LAW to Amend the Dogs (Licensing and Controlling) Law, 1963.

Enacted by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1 - This Law may be cited as the Dogs (Licensing and Short title Controlling) (Amendment) Law, 1965, and shall come into effect on a date to be appointed by the Administrator by Government Notice.

Amendment

2 - The Dogs (Licensing and Controlling) Law, 1963, is hereby amended by the addition of the following new section at the end thereof -

- "Power to destroy 14 (1) Notwithstanding anything herein contained the Chief of Police may with the approval of the Administrator by Government Notice specify a day, not being less than 14 days after the publication of the Notice, when any dog found in any highway or place of public resort within a specified area not wearing a collar with a tag bearing its licence number attached thereto as required by this Law will be liable to be destroyed.
 - (2) It shall be lawful for the Chief of Police and his duly authorised agents on such specified day to destroy without further notice any dogs so found not wearing a collar with tag as required by this Law.
 - (3) No owner or person in charge of any dog so destroyed shall have any right of action or claim to compensation, unless he shall prove that the dog so destroyed was wearing a collar with tag as aforesaid.".
