

The Cayman Islands Customs Consolidation Law

(Law 1 of 1897)

The Government Warehouse (Amendment) Regulations, 1966.

Made by the Legislative Assembly with the approval of the Administrator in exercise of powers conferred by section 4 of the Cayman Islands Customs Consolidation Law, 1897.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Government Warehouse (Amendment) Regulations, 1966 and shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1967.

2. Regulation 9 of the Government Warehouse Regulations, 1954 (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations) is hereby amended by the addition of the following sentence at the end thereof –

“There shall be paid a fee of £3 before the grant of every permission to berth.”

3. The principal regulations are hereby amended by deleting Regulation 11 and replacing it as follows –

“11. The Tidewaiter shall be entitled to demand and receive as warehousing from the owners or consignees of all goods landed at the rates following:-

4. Regulation 13 of the principal regulations is hereby amended as follows —

(a) by substituting the words "two pennies" for the words "one penny" where they occur immediately following the words "warehouse rental fees calculated at the rate of";

(b) by substituting the words "six pence" for the words "two pence" where they occur immediately following the words "warehouse rental fees shall be calculated at the rate of" in proviso (a) thereto.

5. The principal regulations are hereby amended by the addition of a new regulation immediately following regulation 13 —

“13A. The warehousing and warehouse rental fees collectable on goods that have been exempted from or are subject to payment of reduced customs duties and tonnage tax shall be double that of the normal rate.”
