THE MOTOR VEHICLES (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 1966.

- 1. In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Administrator in Council by section 31 of the Motor Vehicles Law, 1961 the following Regulations are hereby made -
- 2. These Regulations may be cited as the Motor Vehicles (Amendment) Regulations 1966 and shall come into operation on a day to be appointed by the Administrator by Government Notice published in the Cayman Islands.
- 3. Regulations 12 of the Motor Vehicles Regulations, 1961 (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations) is hereby amended by deleting sub-regulation 2 (d) and substituting the following therefor -
 - "(2) (d) the name and address of the owner of the motor vehicle;".
- 4. Regulation 19 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by substituting the words "five shillings" for the words "one shilling" where they occur in line twelve thereof.
- 5. Regulation 20 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by deleting the proviso to sub-regulation (1) thereof and substituting the following therefor -
 - "Always provided that any person above the age of 17 years visiting the Islands, if he holds an International Driving Certificate or a valid Driving Licence of the country in which he is domiciled, may on production of such licence and a fee of 10s (ten shillings) be permitted to drive a motor vehicle of the same category or class as that which he is already licensed to drive during stay in the Islands for a period not exceeding the expiration of the current licensing year. Such person shall produce his International Driving Certificate or valid Driving Licence on demand by a police Officer."
- 6. Form D in the Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by substituting the figures "5/-" for the figure "1/-" where they occur therein.
