MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Consequent on the recent devaluation of the Jamaican Pound and the passing of Government Motion No. 19 at the meeting of the Legislature held on the 27th of November, 1967, the rates payable to Checkers, Foremen, and Watchmen at docks etc. were increased as set out in the Working Days and Hours and Scales of Remuneration (Amendment) (No. 3) Regulations, 1967 with effect from the 21st of November, 1967.

The Customs Law

(Cap 31)

The Working Days and Hours and Scales of Remuneration (Amendment) (No. 3) Regulations, 1967

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 of the Customs Law, the following Regulations are hereby made by the Administrator in Council.

Cap. 31

- 1 These Regulations may be cited as the Working Days and Hours and scales of Remuneration (Amendment) (No. 3) Regulations and shall be read and construed as one with the Working Days and Hours and scales of Remuneration Regulations, 1964, (hereinafter referred to as the principal Regulations) and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 21st of November, 1967.
- 2 Regulation $\,6$ of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by substituting the figures "11/9d", "11/-" and "7/-" respectively for the figures "8/6d", "8/-" and "5/-" where they occur therein.

Amendment of Regulation 6.

3 - Regulation 6A of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by substituting the figures "25/-" and "33/6" respectively for the figures "18/-" and "24/-" where they occur therein.
