A Law to allow and confirm certain expenditure during the financial year 1965.

Enacted by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

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1. This Law may be cited as the Supplementary Appropriation (1965) Law, 1966.

A Law to amend the Motor Vehicles Law, 1961.

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Enacted by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1. This Law may be cited as the Motor Vehicles (Amendment) (No. 3) Law, 1966 and shall come into operation on a day to be appointed by the Administrator by Government Notice published in the Cayman Islands.

2. Section 13 of the Motor Vehicles Law, 1961 (hereinafter referred to as the principal law) is hereby amended by the addition of the following new subsection –

“(4) Notwithstanding the provisions of any law to the contrary, proceeding against the driver of a motor vehicle for an offence against this section shall be validly instituted by any member of the Police Force issuing to such driver at the time
