A LAW TO AMEND THE REGIONAL PLANNING LAW, 1934

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

Short title and
commencement.

1 - This Law may be cited as the Regional Planning (Amendment) Law, 1967 and shall come into operation on a day to be appointed by the Administrator by Government Notice published in the Cayman Islands.

Amendment of
Section 3 of
Law 11 of 1934.

2 - Section 3 of the Regional Planning Law, 1934 is hereby amended as follows—

(a) by the deletion of the item "(a) the Administrator," from subsection (1) thereof and the consequential renumbering of present items (b) (c) (d) (e) (f) (g) and (h) accordingly;

2 (No. 3) The Regional Planning (Amendment) Law, 1967

- (b) by the insertion of the word "Assistant" between the word "the" and the word "Administrator" wherever they occur in subsections (3) and (4) thereof.

A LAW TO AMEND THE PUBLIC HOLIDAYS LAW, 1913

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

Short title and
commencement.

1 - This Law may be cited as the Public Holidays (Amendment) Law, 1967 and shall come into operation on a day to be appointed by the Administrator by Government Notice published in the Cayman Islands.

New Schedule
to Law 7 of
1913.

2 - The Schedule to the Public Holidays Law, 1913 is hereby deleted and replaced as follows -

"SCHEDULE

1. New Year's Day, or in case New Year's Day falls on Sunday, the day after New Year's Day.
2. Ash Wednesday.
3. Good Friday.
4. Easter Monday.
5. 3rd Monday in May, to be known as Commonwealth Day or Day of Tree planting by school children.
