Enacted by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1. This Law may be cited as the Judicature (Administra- short title, tion of Justice (Amendment) (No. 2) Law, 1967 and shall and be read and construed as one with the Judicature (Administration of Justice) Law, (hereinafter referred to astheprincipal law) and shall come into operation on a day to be appointed by the Administrator by Government Notice published in the Cayman Islands.

2. Section 211 of the principal Law is hereby amended Amendment of by adding thereto the following subsection as subsection (4):-

" (4) The provisions of the Law conferring a right of appeal in civil cases and matters shall be construed liberally in favour of such right; and in case any of the provisions of this Law shall have been inadvertently, or from ignorance or necessity omitted to be 2

observed, it shall be lawful for the Court of Appeal, if it appears that such omission has arisen from inadvertence, ignorance or necessity, and if the justice of the case shall appear so to require, with or without terms to admit the appellant to impeach the judgment, order or proceeding appealed from."

- 3. Section 213 of the principal Law is hereby amended in the following respects:-
 - (a) by inserting in subsection (1) next after the words "lodging the appeal" the words "taking or";
 - (b) by deleting from subsection (1) the words "for the due prosecution of such appeal, and";
 - (c) by deleting from subsection (4) the word "ten" and substituting therefor the word "twenty-one";
 - (d) by inserting in subsection (4) next after the words "his right of appeal shall" the words "subject to the provisions of subsection (4) of section 211".

Addition of new Section 213A.

4. The principal Law is hereby amended by inserting next after section 213 the following as section 213A:-

Grounds of

- 213A (1) The grounds of appeal shall set out concisely the facts and points of law (if any) on which the appellant intends to rely in support of his appeal and shall conclude with a statement of the relief prayed for by the appellant.
- (2) The Court of Appeal may dismiss without hearing, any appeal in which the grounds of appeal do not comply with the provisions of subsection (1)."
